From the Pastor's Corner

2 Corinthians 5:17 "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!"

I know that change can be worrisome. In an Olympic/Election year, we are confronted with an unknown future as we wait impatiently for events to unfold. Changes are also happening in this year for our church, and I'd like to go over what they might be, what I project them to be, and what has already been decided. I hope to bring clarity to a number of issues.

I have been your pastor now for over 7 years. In that time, major changes have been few and far between. The first large change we made together was in 2011 with the addition of a Contemporary Worship service, a service which, 5 years later, is attended by 75 people each week. They may be our smallest worshiping group by number, but they are faithful! (Over half of the churches in our presbytery have less than 75 worshipers on a given Sunday. We currently average well over 300 in total).

Possible Related Change: I think all three worship services might be enhanced if the Contemporary Worship service could move into its own worship space, namely, Mehaffey Hall. The sanctuary could be returned to a more formal look, and the CW people could have a more relaxed and size appropriate place to worship. Although this has been discussed in committee, no firm decisions have been proposed nor has the cost of the move been calculated.

The second large change we made was in 2016 with the closing of our daycare. This is a big change for us which will happen on the last day of operations for the daycare, June 7. The third large change we made, also in 2016, was the paying off our mortgage. This has removed a \$30,000 budget item from our annual costs.

Possible Related Change: I think that we need to consider renovating our classroom space, including the former daycare rooms that have seen 26 years of almost daily use. We might want to also rethink configurations of those rooms as well, especially when we consider their multiple uses. Although this has been discussed in committee, no firm decisions have been proposed nor has the cost of the move been calculated.

Other big changes might be on the horizon. The session did authorize the creation of an organ fund with the possibility of using funds to enhance our existing organ. It was agreed that this move was speculative in that no fund raising campaign was authorized beyond the creation of the fund, seeded by the proceeds of the concert. Though Heasuk's organ concert was a big success, she would have to hold 100 more concerts to get the funds needed for the work, if that were our sole method of fund raising. The concert was a great first step in finding out if members of our congregation have the enthusiasm to donate funds for our organ moving forward. The organ is working fine, for now. Enhancing the organ with the addition of pipes will assist with the maintenance of

divine worship. Although the creation of an organ fund has been authorized by the session and plans have been discussed in committee, no firm decisions have been proposed nor has the final cost been calculated. How much money we raise will be the greatest determining factor in how we enhance the organ.

Do you see a pattern here? I believe that change in church should be slow and deliberate. Each of our big three changes were only made after months of prayerful consideration and deliberation by committees and the session. In that spirit, I want us to take the next 12 to 15 months or so to consider some of these new potential changes. Is there a new mission that might now benefit the community? We will find out. What should the church school look like moving forward? We will assess our current and future needs. What is missing in the way of meeting and worship space? We will look for answers. Do we have members who would like to see the organ and the music it brings to worship enhanced? We will ask. Are we financially prepared for the replacement of air conditioners and leaky roofs? We are.

We want a church that serves all of God's people well, both for our members and for our community and beyond.

God is leading us in a new direction. Thanks be to God. -- Ron Watson

Hurricane season has started. Do you have an evacuation plan? Do you know when to leave? (Answer: when voluntary evacuation is called for, not mandatory). Do you have flashlights, batteries, water, and non-perishable food items ready? Do you have family or friend contacts to make in case of an evacuation so they will know you are safe? Do you know where you are going to evacuate to? Do you have a travel charger for your phone? Do you have a cell phone? Do you have a plan for pets? Do you know to keep your car full of gas in the summer to avoid lines at the pump should an evacuation be necessary? Make these decisions now, and you will be ready should a storm come.


