From the Pastor's Corner

Psalm 34:14: Depart from evil, and do good;

seek peace, and pursue it.

Who are we? Who has God called us to be? How do we live out the Gospel? What words express who we are as a church and as Christians? These are the questions that your session is currently pondering. One way or the other, what we say about our faith has everything to do with how we carry out that faith. The words, when finalized, will ring true for many. Others will find them less expressive of their own Christian identity. We should expect this, especially as Presbyterians. Long ago, we came together in Philadelphia, 1788 in fact, to discuss how we might get along even when we are not completely of one mind. In that meeting, we reaffirmed words from the Westminster Confession, ""God alone is lord of the conscience, and hath left it free from the doctrines and commandments of men (and women) which are in anything contrary to his Word." In reunion which happened for the PCUSA in 1983 in Atlanta, these helpful words were adopted in this same spirit by a newly united church:

"The polity of Presbyterianism-with its strong insistence on the rule of the majority and the rights of the minority-is indeed the way in which Presbyterians affirm their unity amid their diversity. This polity not only organizes dissent and diversity, it is itself a product of dissent, diversity, compromise, and the creative resolution of bitter conflict. We are very inclined to the fallacy that trouble in the church is unique to a particular time and to a particular situation. This can lead to the erroneous conviction that if we only were faithful enough or smart enough or tried hard enough, we could solve the church's problems."

We might even add "the world's problems!"

So a mission statement is a working document, a motto of sorts, ideally 12 words or less, that 1. Encapsulate our core beliefs and 2. Guide us to where we would set our feet because we, together, hold these core beliefs.

I don't know what the statement is going to say yet, but I can't wait to find out! So please pray for your elders, that they will listen carefully for the still small voice of God in formulating, with God's guidance, a mission statement.

Our summer services are concluded with Montreat Youth Sunday August 27, and September 3 returns us to our "regularly scheduled programming." I do hope that if you attended the unity services, you experienced the unity of Christ, that is, all of those people who call Trinity home coming together to meet each other and worship the Lord with one voice. We are a strong congregation for Jesus.

I left our VBS Bible passage up at the beginning of the article. Now, more than ever, we want to "do good, seek peace, and go after it."

Hi all! I have had an awesome summer filled with mission trips, Vacation Bible School, Montreat, and youth summer fun days. School is now back in session and we are gearing up for the return of weekly youth meetings and fall Sunday School.

We will continue a one-room Sunday School class September 3rd, 10th, and 17th. On Sunday, September 24th we will begin our 3 age based classes:

Children and Worship taught by Karen Thomas (pre-k and kindergarten)

Submerged taught by myself (5th-12th).

Advantages of the Trinity Columbarium

As of 2013, 62% of FL citizens are cremated. These numbers are expected to rise to near 80% in the next ten years.

Trinity's newly negotiated agreement for the cost of a basic cremation through Heritage Cremation is \$795.

Additional charges include:

- \$50 medical examiner fee
- \$10 for each death certificate
- Box for cremains
- Obituary announcement

The cost of a niche in the Trinity Columbarium for members is \$500.

So, the combined cost of a niche in the columbarium and cremation is approximately \$1,400.

The cost of a traditional funeral, including the cost of the casket, is within the \$6000 - \$10,000 range.

Additionally, the cost of a traditional cemetery plot is \$2500 - \$4000.

So, depending on where funeral services are held and how many people attend, the average funeral can run around \$10,000 - \$20,000.

By comparison, the cost of cremation and a niche in Trinity's Columbarium is in the \$1,400 range.

Although our columbarium has 384 niches, only 70 of those remain unsold. Of these, only 16 are side-by-side.

Facility Care Team Accomplishments for Spring/Summer 2017

- Added a "Waiting Bench" outside the narthex doors.
- Completed the finishing work around the new air handler in the nursery room.
- Painted and brightened the nursery.
- New fence and trees around the propane gas tank.
- New enclosure of the "White House" around the irrigation system pump house.
Shrubbery to be added.
- Thorough landscaping completed in July.
- Trees all around the property were trimmed.
- The roof was washed as part of maintenance and up keep program.
- Downspouts were extended to improve water runoff.
- Gutter structure improved in the courtyard area near office door.
- New exterior lights for narthex doors and north side of building.

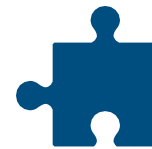
