PASTOR'S MESSAGE

"Yes or No"

Dr. Jeff Beebe

A journey of faith brings with it many a decision. It has always been such. As the disciples journeyed with Jesus during his life and ministry, they often found themselves faced with impactful decisions, individually, and as a group. Much of this had to do with their calling. As we read of the people of God throughout the Scriptures, we find numerous accounts of the people of God wrestling, once again, individually, and corporately with impactful decisions. Checking "yes" or "no" is ordinarily a simple response to something asked of us. "Yes or "no" decisions are sometimes simple and sometimes not. The 80's band The Clash shares the struggle in their song entitled, "Should I Stay, or Should I Go." Again, a journey of faith brings with it many a decision. More often than not, these decisions are in response to what we have been called to be and what we have been called to do, individually, and as a community of faith, as the people of God.

Thomas Merton's prayer, which follows, is both individual and corporate and perhaps a prayer for us during this time of transition.

My Lord God, I have no idea where I am going. I do not see the road ahead of me. I cannot know for certain where it will end, nor do I really know myself, and the fact that I think I am following your will does not mean that I am actually doing so. But I believe that the desire to please you does in fact please you. And I hope I have that desire in all that I am doing. I hope that I will never do anything apart from that desire. And I know that if I do this you will lead me by the right road, though I may know nothing about it. Therefore, will I trust you always, though I may seem to be lost and in the shadow of death. I will not fear, for you are ever with me, and you will never leave me to face my perils alone.

So many of you have asked me the "yes" or "no" question, would I consider staying? Before I answer this question, let me introduce to you the process of discernment. As we were reminded in Merton's prayer, our wrestling with impactful decisions, both individually and together, are simply part of the discernment process.

Here's a brief summary of what the Presbytery of Saint Augustine, in accordance with the Book of Order, has to say on this "yes" or "no" question. *Ordinarily, a transitional pastor may not be considered to become the next installed pastor of a congregation he or she has served in a temporary capacity (Book of Order G-2.0504b). If the decision is made to call a temporary pastor, the Pastor Nominating Committee prepares and submits to the Presbytery a full statement of its rationale for requesting an exception. This statement shall include an affirmation that Trinity's PNC has conducted a full and open search for other candidates. The Presbytery, if satisfied that the PNC has done a valid search and that the individual is the best candidate for the position then an exception would be granted with a 3/4 vote of the Presbytery.*

And thus, here is the tremendous prayerful discerning task of Trinity's newly elected Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC), in coordination with the Presbytery, in order that a "yes" or "no" decision can be made.

So, during this time, might we be reminded of my current transitional task (to which I emphatically said, "YES") which has been, and will continue to be that of journeying with the members and friends of Trinity Presbyterian Church of Palm Coast until such a time that the PNC presents your next installed pastor.

At a Special Called Meeting on August 18, and its Stated Meeting on August 19, 2019, your session,

- Approved a Congregational meeting for Sunday, August 25, 2019, for the purpose of electing a Pastor Nominating Committee.
- Received new active members, *Frances and George Sampson* by Re-affirmation of Faith, and *Charles Ako-Addo*, by transfer from First Presbyterian Church in Irvington, NJ.
- Noted the deaths of Deacon Joan Nelms on June 10, 2019, Glenwick Elliott on July 12, 2019; Patty Yarotsky on July 17, 2019.
- Approved transferring the memberships of John and Ellen Bertolacci to St. Mark by the Sea Lutheran Church in Palm Coast; also removing Claire Santuae and William Gould from the active membership rolls, as they requested.
- Noted that Elder Helene Read has resigned from Session and the Nominations Committee.
- Heard the report from the Finance Committee concerning income and expenses. For the month of July and Year-to-date, expenses slightly exceeded income.
- Noted that 12 new Communion sets have been purchased for those serving Home Communion, thanks to an anonymous donor.
- Appointed Elder Lance Alred to be the second session member on the Nominations Committee, replacing Helene Read.
- Noted that new office hours at Trinity will be Monday through Thursday, 8:30am to 1:30pm.
- Approved a Resolution of Thanks for Helene Read for her willingness to serve many years as an elder and deacon.

Poor nutrition has lasting implications. In extreme cases, poor nutrition can lead to physical deformities such as Rickets and low birth weight babies. More commonly, poor nutrition leads to heart disease, anemia, diabetes and high blood pressure.

The Beth-El Farmworker Ministry Hunger Relief initiative supports 500 to 700 families weekly with fresh produce, dry goods, meats, and other essential products that promote healthy living. The main food distribution occurs on Tuesdays from 9am to 2pm at Beth-El campus. Additional distributions occur through our mission to farm outreach.

Our lodging and all meals will be at Cedarkirk Camp and Presbyterian Center in Lithia, Florida.



CHRISTIAN EDUCATION & YOUTH UPDATE

As we start a new school year, I am reminded that the world around us is constantly changing. The only constant we have in our lives is God. The world does change, the church does change, the way in which we respond to God changes but God doesn't change. He is the same today, yesterday, and tomorrow.

On Sunday, September 8th our two adult Sunday school classes will resume. The Disciples Class will be led by Jef Amsbaugh and uses the "Present Word" as their study material. Our Book Study will be led by June Carlson and will be studying "The Case for Miracles by Lee Strobel." All materials are provided for all Sunday school classes. Both classes begin at 9am and welcome both drop-ins and new visitors.

I have fielded some questions about educational opportunities for children, youth, and families here at Trinity, so I wanted to explain our thoughts on faith formation. Years ago we had a Sunday school class for each grade level, volunteers to teach each class and children in each class. In the 5 years that I have been here, we have researched, tried, read, studied and prayed about how we can best help and guide children, youth and families in the development of their relationship with God. The largest predictor of a child's participation in church throughout their lives directly correlates to the number of relationships the child makes in their church. Faith is something that is experienced together; through sacraments, through experiences and through love. The key word here is "together." We want to bring families, grandparents, singles and friends together to grow in faith. We want to give them the tools they need to continue faith conversations at home, at work, and in the community.

On September 22nd we will begin "Connect 4" in the Fellowship Hall. This will be held every Sunday from 9:30am-9:50am and will include something for everyone. Our mission is to connect individuals and families with God, the church, the community, and grow in their own personal faith journey. There will be something there for everyone to connect with. Drop in when you can and make connections!

We will continue to offer Children's Church during the 10am Worship Hour. Children are dismissed after the Children's Sermon and return by the last hymn. We cover the scriptures for the day and use older youth to help mentor the younger children. This enables youth to be a part of the worship experience and also to have a time to connect with scripture on their own level.

The Pumpkin Spiced Latte is already available at Starbucks and Dunkin, so we know that fall is just around the corner! Our pumpkins are arriving October 12th and our patch will be open from October 13th-the 31st daily from 11am-7pm. Be on the lookout for a signup sheet in the Narthex to sign up for a volunteer slot! This is a great fundraiser for our youth, but also a great way to interact with the community.

Lastly, we hope you all will join us Sunday, September 8th at 10am for our Annual High School Youth Led Worship Service. The youth have been working hard to plan a service that is full of reminders of God's love and God's call for our lives. All are invited to a fellowship lunch immediately following the Worship Service.
