

Session Briefs

At its Stated Meeting on October 28, 2019, your session,

- Approved, with “gracious regret”, the transfer of Karen Thomas to First Presbyterian Church in Fort Collins, CO
- Received new active members, *Larry Jones*, by Letter of Transfer from First Presbyterian Church in Durham, NC; *Johnathon Jones*, by Profession of Faith.
- Approved Baptism for Mark Jones.
- Noted the death of Daniel Boone on October 8, 2019.
- Heard the report from the Finance Committee concerning income and expenses. Expenses were higher than income. Unpledged income is significantly below what is expected by this time of year.
- Noted that the picnic on October 13th was a success, and that something like that, involving the entire congregation, should be done quarterly.
- Noted that the exterior of the church will be painted.
- Approved a Congregational Meeting for November 17, 2019, for the purpose of electing elders and deacons.
- Approved the Trinity Presbyterian Church Strategic Plan.
- Noted that Brooke Tucker is doing a fantastic job with Trinity’s youth.

Finance/Stewardship Update

Stewardship

The stewardship letter below and ministry plan were mailed in October and are reprinted here in case someone did not receive it. Additional pledge cards are available in the church office.



October 2019

We have much to be thankful for at Trinity, and are grateful for the time, treasure, and talents God has provided in 2019. Trinity Presbyterian Church's mission statement, as approved by Session, states the church "is called by God, through our Lord Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, to be a worshipping, nurturing and serving community." The chart to the right represents how we have been living out our faith through the Christian practices of worshipping, learning, caring and reaching out using the 2019 spending plan. This is important because it represents how the Trinity Presbyterian church community expresses our faith together and pursues the opportunities that God has entrusted to us.

As you review the 2019 plan here are a few things to keep in mind as you prayerfully consider your 2020 pledge. The Finance/Stewardship Committee would like to increase the 2020 general offering revenue (modestly!), the first time in several years. This would allow Trinity to do the following.



- Increase funding that supports the Learning ministry area, especially our children and youth, as well as provide staff learning opportunities through a training fund.
- Increase funding for Worshipping ministry area to fully support music and pastor nominating committee activities.
- Provide additional support to the Caring ministry in the areas of Congregational Life and Membership/Evangelism activities.
- The Reaching Out ministry only reflects operating budget items such as a portion of personnel costs, administrative expenses, building fixed costs, and our Presbytery commitments. The Missions budget is supported separately through the Birthday Mission Fund as well as revenue from previous bequests. Donations to support our Missions activities are always appreciated!

On Sunday, November 10th, as part of our 40th Anniversary worship service, you will be invited to return the enclosed 2020 pledge card. If you are uncomfortable with that visible expression, you can always return your pledge card to the office at a convenient time. Whether in the willingness to give in ministry or in the provision of financial resources, both elements represent our desire to consecrate ourselves to our gracious God. Your giving has an impact so that together we can continue to be a worshipping, nurturing and serving community now and for many years to come.

TRINITY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH MINISTRY PLAN

Our 2019 Ministry Plan is more than dollars and percentages. Our annual Ministry Plan is not only a budget - it's a strategic plan to impact and change lives. The 2019 Ministry Plan was developed by Trinity's Finance/Stewardship Committee with careful planning and prayer, review and input from committees, and approved by Session last December. Each dollar is vital in fulfilling our church's mission to be a worshiping, nurturing and serving community. The story below offers you a broad picture that connects the 2019 operating budget to Trinity's mission and ministry. Please read this story carefully and prayerfully consider how you want to respond when you complete and return your 2020 pledge card on Commitment Sunday, November 10th, 2019.

REVENUE

Trinity is primarily supported by the generous gifts of our members and friends through their tithes and offerings as an act of their faith and worship. Projected 2019 general offering in the operating budget represents 96% of total revenue with the remaining 4% from various other sources (facility use, columbarium, holiday fair, bank interest).

WORSHIPING

Our church celebrates the vibrancy of its worship. We gather in various ways to celebrate God's presence and where we listen to God's call to service in our world. Our ministry personnel, working with the organist and Worship Committee, prepare the weekly worship services. We offer worship each week at 10:00 on Sundays and special worship services at other times.

LEARNING

Through faith formation, each of us grows in our knowledge of what it means to be the people of God in our world. We provide education for children and youth, through children's worship during the service hour. A nursery is available for babies and toddlers. We provide space for Scouts, the Community Chorus of Palm Coast, Classical Conversations, and Alcoholics Anonymous.

Weekly youth group gatherings encourage middle- and high-school students to spend time together. Adult study and reflection happen throughout the year through Bible study, women's gatherings, and men's breakfasts. In our adult gatherings, we seek to experience the mystery of God's presence in our lives as we explore, question, and talk together. Special classes throughout the year bring together adults who will become elders and deacons, and youth who want to reaffirm their baptismal vows for themselves.

- Teen confirmation classes
- Sponsorship of Scouts
- Staff time, space, and supplies

CARING

We offer ongoing caring and support to all members and friends of our congregation and to any with whom we cross paths as we live out our faith. We respond to individuals in times of crisis, such as illness or bereavement. We keep in touch with members who are housebound or who live in senior communities and can no longer come to church. Our ministry personnel and volunteer visitors want to make this church a caring community where each person is able to feel the love of God being shared with one another.

Key points:

The Session and the Finance/Stewardship Committee are committed to providing regular financial updates to our members and friends. The following financial information is for the fiscal year through September 2019.

- Total budgeted operating amount needed per month is \$31,286. Total Operating Revenue was \$21,894 for September and total Operating Expenses for September were \$26,761.
- Total operating expenses through the first nine months are within a percent of the ideal 75% mark. The committee noted that pledges are a little above 76% (favorable); however, the “Unpledged” line is significantly below (56%) the expected 2019 amount by about \$20,197. Comparing this same line to 2018 through September, the 2019 “Unpledged” amount received is about \$29,600 less than 2018.
- In Miscellaneous Operating Revenue, Trinity received \$215 from AmTrust Insurance Company (previous Workers Compensation policy holder) as part of the 2018 dividend program. Under Insurance expense, Trinity received a partial refund of \$725 as part of the 2019 Workers Compensation audit covering 12/31/2018 to 6/25/2019.

40 Years at Trinity

Trinity Presbyterian Handbell Choir

In the fall of 1997, two octaves of Schulmerich Handbells were donated to the church. The next summer a group was formed and rehearsals began with Doris Prior, Director of Music. Two octaves of Choir Chimes were given later and more bells purchased with Memorial Funds, or other donations directed to the Choir. Today we have 4 1/2 octaves of both Bells and Chimes for a total of 54 each. To use the Bells and Chimes to their fullest extent, 12 Ringers are required with the need of a couple of substitutes.

As the years rolled by and the number of Bells and Chimes increased, the Ringers grew with their ability to ring more and more complex music. Composers have increased the styles and complexity of incorporating the blend of Bells and Chimes to new levels and our Handbell Choir members have grown with the music.

Over the years, Trinity Handbell Choir has shared our unique form of music with our neighbors in the Palm Coast area. For several years we were featured at the Flagler Library "Festival of Trees," the Marketplace for "A Festival of Music," and have played at Advent Hospital, Flagler. We also performed at special luncheons around the area, at nursing homes, and wherever we were asked representing Trinity Presbyterian Church. In December 2018 we were privileged to perform with our organist, Heasuk Che, in a Holiday Concert which was well attended and received. Through the year, the Choir plays in worship services monthly and on special Holy Days. All the members are dedicated to the Choir and the many rehearsals required.

The purpose of the Handbell Choir is to give praise and glory to Our Loving God and help those who hear receive His Blessing and go forth with His Love.

It has been a great honor to work with this wonderful group for the past 16 years, and new members are always welcome and needed.

Important Driving and Parking Directions for the dinner:

1. Parking is limited, so carpooling is highly recommended.
2. Exit the Trinity parking lot and turn south (right) on Florida Park Drive. Turn right on Fleetwood Drive (.9 mile). Fleetwood Drive only goes right.
3. Take Fleetwood Drive to Old Kings Road N. (.8mile). The VFW is straight ahead.
4. For handicapped parking, those with limited mobility, or to drop off passengers: Turn left onto Old Kings Road. Make a right at the first driveway onto VFW property. Make a right and drive past the building to the north end of the property. Turn left and drive south under the portico to the front double doors. Let passengers disembark. Park on the VFW lot in handicapped spots in front or on the grass all along the entrance driveway or in back. .
5. For those with no mobility problems, park on the grass berm just before the stop sign, either to the left or right. Let the parking attendants direct you. A police officer will assist you in crossing Old Kings Road.

Quilt of Valor

Sgt. Robert J. Tabit was recently honored to be presented with a “Quilt of Valor” awarded by the Quilt of Valor Foundation. It was presented at a Garden Club meeting where he served as President for several years.

The process began in January 2019. The quilt was created by Pat Mauer, member of the Palm Coast Quilters and former member of the Palm Coast Garden Club, and presented by Peggy Manley, due to Pat being out of state at the time.

Robert enlisted in the United States Army in February 1951 and served in the Korean conflict, identifying prisoners of war prior to the prisoner exchange at the end of the war. He was awarded the Korean Service Medal, the United Nations Service Medal, and the National Defense Service Medal. He was discharged from Camp Kilmer, New Jersey on January 28, 1954.
