"Deck the Halls"

Through the years this light-hearted carol never crossed my mind as having much theological significance, yet on this day as I am gathering my December thoughts, "Deck the Halls" presents itself for serious reflection.

Deck the Halls is a traditional Christmas, yuletide, and New Years' carol. The phrase, deck the halls is derived from a well-loved Christmas song, entitled Deck the Halls. The song/carol takes its melody from the Welsh air Nos Galan which means New Year's Eve, and dates at least to the 1500's. The lyrics were written in 1862 by Thomas Oliphant, a Scottish musician. What we now often sing are a 1877 variation which made the song more appropriate (which is why I will now share the lyrics – source Wikipedia).

Deck the hall with boughs of holly, 'Tis the season to be jolly, **Don we now our gay apparel**, Troll the ancient Christmas carol,

See the **blazing yule** before us, Strike the harp and join the chorus. Follow me in merry measure, While I **tell of Christmas treasure**,

Fast away the old year passes, Hail the new, ye lads and lasses! Sing we joyous all together, Heedless of the wind and weather,



To deck the halls means to decorate for Christmas and to decorate is often to prepare for something which is to come. So as we prepare to celebrate what is to come, let us also give thanks to what has been and might we all *Sing we joyus all together*!

The late Ann Weems helps us now in our decorating, in our preparations as she has penned so eloquently in, "To Listen, To Look".

Is it all sewn up - my life?

Is it at this point so predictable, so orderly, so neat, so arranged, so right,

that I don't have time or space for listening for the rustle of angel's wings or running to stables to see a baby?

Could this be what he meant when he said

Listen, those who have ears to hear ... Look, those who have eyes to see?

O God, give me the humbleness of those shepherds who say in the cold December darkness the Coming of Light the Advent of Love!


Session Briefs

Key points:

The Session and the Finance/Stewardship Committee are committed to providing regular financial updates to our members and friends. The following financial information is for the fiscal year through October 2019.

- Total budgeted operating amount needed per month is \$31,286. Total operating revenue was \$22,321 for October and total operating expenses for October were \$31,466. Finance Committee reviewed 2019 revenue projections and have significant concerns that operating revenue continues to fall behind expenses. This has led to an \$11,629.65 uncommitted balance as of 10/31/19 in the Intracoastal Bank checking account to cover operating needs. To cover fixed costs only (defined as Personnel, Insurance, Utilities, and Office), Trinity needs a minimum of \$26,271 in revenue per month. Unfortunately, revenue received has been below that amount for the last four months. The Treasurer is ensuring funds are available to cover checks before signing.
- The committee noted that 2019 pledges are a little above 84% (favorable); however, the "Unpledged" line is significantly below (58.9%) the expected 2019 amount by about \$26,135. Comparing this same line to 2018 through October, the 2019 "Unpledged" amount received is about \$30,600 less than 2018.

Stewardship Update

As we enter the Advent season, Trinity is developing plans and budgets for 2020. Trinity has been blessed for the last 40 years with many people who provided the vision and resources to build a church community that not only nurtures our parishioners, but also supports our local and global communities. During the months of October and November, the Finance/Stewardship Committee has been gathering information from the committees to develop a proposed 2020 budget for Session's consideration. An integral part of the budget process is the receipt of 2020 pledges from our members and friends. Historically, pledges have represented approximately 60% of the total operating income received. Pledge cards for 2020 were mailed in October and completed pledges were received on Sunday, November 10th during the 40th Anniversary Sunday service. Pledges can be still be submitted by placing them in the offering plate or sending them to the church financial office. As always, the Finance/Stewardship Committee is grateful to our members and friends who continue to support Trinity Presbyterian Church.

40 Years at Trinity

The Chrismon Tree

Chrismons are symbols, a combination of two words, Christ and Monogram, meaning a monogram of Christ. These were ancient symbols early Christians used to identify themselves and mark meeting places. They served the greater purpose of sharing faith and beliefs among the population.

A Chrismon tree is an evergreen placed in the chancel of the church during Advent. The evergreen tree symbolizes the eternal life Jesus Christ provides. The Chrismon tree is only decorated with clear lights and Chrismons made from white and gold materials. These are the liturgical colors of the Christmas season and refer to the Lords purity and perfection and his majesty and glory.



Each Chrismon depicts ancient symbols for Christ and his ministry. Some of these include:

Budded Cross Burning Torch

Butterfly Cup Celtic cross Chalice

Chi Rho Christmas rose
Circle and triangle Cross and crown

Cross pattee Daisy

Dove Epiphany star
Fish Flour de lis
Harp Jerusalem cross

Lamb Lamp Manger Shamrock

Shell with drops of water

Shepherd's crook

Trumpet
