

SESSION BRIEFS

At its Stated Meeting on July 20, 2020, your session,

- Noted the deaths of Active Members Marilyn Kopach (6/21/20), Jason Peters (6/25/20);
 Derris Ledin (6/25/20).
- Approved the use of the Sanctuary for the wedding of church member Lexie Butler and Zack Tyler on November 21, 2021.
- Heard that the Youth Mission Trip to Beth-El went very well.
- Approved the purchase of Copyright Licenses for music that is used during our on-line worship services.
- Approved opening of Mehaffey Hall and adjoining bathrooms <u>only</u> for outside groups (scouts, AA, Classical Conversations) with a <u>maximum</u> number of 50 persons attending. They must wear masks and practice social distancing and sanitize before and after meeting.
- Approved lighting up the cross at the top of the building.
- Noted that financially, revenue was down in June compared to May.
- Noted that a more emphasis will be given to Stewardship this year.
- Noted that for the time being, Sunday morning worship will continue to be on-line. Sunday evening vespers will be held outside near the Pavilion.
