John 2:13-22

## MINUTES OF THE 41<sup>st</sup> ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING February 21, 2021

The congregation of Trinity Presbyterian Church, Palm Coast, Florida, held its forty-first annual meeting on Sunday, February 28, 2021, in the Sanctuary at 11:00 AM following the Sunday worship service. The meeting was moderated by Pastor Dr. Jeffrey Beebe, and the Clerk of Session, Jane Pellmann, served as secretary.

The secretary advised that a quorum was present. The meeting was called to order at 11:02 with prayer by the moderator. The docket proposed for the meeting was approved on motion.

The membership statistics for 2020 were presented, as well as the names of individuals received as members in

The membership reports were received on motion.

The Moderator called the attention of the congregation to his Annual Report in the packet and briefly discussed it. He asked the members present for questions and comments; there were none.

The Moderator next directed the attention of the congregation to the reports of the Deacons and the Session Committees (with the exception of the Treasurer and Finance). Members of the congregation were encouraged to direct questions and comments to the various committee and activity moderators or chairpersons. All committee reports were received on motion.

The Moderator asked for the Report of the Nominations Committee. Jane Pellmann presented the slates of nominees for elder and deacon as prepared by the committee. They are:

<u>For Elder in the Class of 2021</u>: Kathleen Cooke, Jennifer Kaczmarek, and Judy Murgitroyde; <u>For Elder in the Class of 2022</u>: Carol Corson, Kelli Jebbia, Martha Gioielli, Leslie Russo, Shelley Wheeler; <u>For Deacon in the Class of 2021</u>: Patty Edwards, Ruth Gordon, Shirley Wilson, Joye Wood, Michael Peters, and for Youth Deacon, Hailey Tucker; <u>For Deacon in the Class of 2022</u>: Bill Butler, Cyndy McCormick, Marlene Williams, Donna Decina.

Since this report was prepared a deacon in the Deacon Class of 2022 has resigned leaving a vacancy in that class; the moderator asked for nominations from the floor to fill this vacancy. There were none, and the slates presented by the committee were elected by the congregation.

At this time, the Moderator called for the election of members from the congregation-at-large for the 2021 Nominations Committee. There was one nomination, and no one volunteered to serve on this committee. Jane Pellmann was elected.

The Moderator went over the Financial Report for 2020, stating that we had ended the year in fairly good shape. The Session has approved a quarterly budget (January through March). Treasurer Martha Gioielli thanked the congregation for keeping up their pledges during the year and also the Session Committees for keeping their expenses in line.

The Moderator asked the congregation to turn to the Necrology in the packet for the meeting and note those Trinity members who had entered the Church Eternal during 2020.

Dr. Beebe announced that his Installation as Pastor will take place on Sunday, April 11, 2021, at 4:00PM.

There was no other business and the meeting was adjourned at 11:25AM with prayer by the Moderator.
