As of the end of February, Trinity finances are on track for a good year. Thank you for your continued generous support for the work of God!

Trinity also contributes to the Presbyterian Church (USA) for our members. Our support of the General Assembly consists of an annual "per capita" payment of \$8.98 per active member, which is used for governance of our denomination, including Board of Pensions for pastoral staff, the Presbyterian Foundation, and various missions. Our support of the St. Augustine Presbytery is called "Unified Giving", and is a contribution rather than an assessed amount. The Presbytery supports seminary students, pastoral staff, and congregations with training, resources, pastoral search assistance and ordination, and various ministries and missions. Some presbyteries group the two components into a single assessed per capita. For example, the National Capital Presbytery in Washington DC has a per capita of \$42.67 per member in 2022.

Please consider assisting Trinity with our contributions to the Presbytery on your behalf. A contribution of \$8.98 for each of your family who is a member of the church will pay for the per capita for the General Assembly. Please also consider a contribution toward the St Augustine Presbytery Unified Giving. You may use your Per Capita envelope or the Per Capita fund on Shelby, or simply indicate Per Capita and/or Unified Giving on your check. Thank you for your generosity. 
