

#### **Reflections from Your Exceptional Finance Team: Did You Know?**

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a tax-advantaged way for people with retirement accounts to give money directly to charity. Here's how it works:

- Who can do it: Only individuals who are age 70½ or older.
- From what account: Distributions must come from an IRA (traditional IRA, SEP IRA, or SIMPLE IRA, but only if not actively contributing).
   Note: QCDs can't be made directly from 401(k)s or other employer retirement plans, but you can roll funds into an IRA first.
- How much: You can donate up to \$100,000 per person per year (\$200,000 for a married couple if both qualify).
- Tax benefits:
- The money donated does not count as taxable income (unlike normal IRA withdrawals).
- The QCD amount can count toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD), which starts at age 73.
- This can reduce your taxable income and potentially lower things like Medicare premiums or taxation of Social Security benefits.
- You cannot also claim the same donation as a charitable deduction the tax benefit comes from exclusion from income, not a deduction.
- Eligible charities: Must be a qualified 501(c)(3) organization. Private foundations, donor-advised funds, and supporting organizations generally don't qualify.

Example: If you're 73 and your RMD for the year is \$15,000, you could direct \$10,000 of that RMD to a qualified charity via a QCD. That \$10,000 won't be included in your taxable income, and you'll only need to take (and possibly pay tax on) the remaining \$5,000.
